There were a total of 2460 criminal and civil cases filed in the Carroll County Municipal Court under Judge Gary L. Willen during 2016.

These included 399 civil complaints and small claims actions, 2060 criminal cases, and 1 rent escrow cases.

Of the 2060 criminal actions, there were 74 felonies, 500 misdemeanors, 151 driving while intoxicated charges, and 1335 other traffic citations.

A breakdown of the filings of the 2060 cases included: 795 by the Sheriff's Department, 671 by the Ohio State Highway Patrol, 147 by the Dog Warden, 21 by the O.D.N.R., 17 by the Lake Patrol, 256 by the Carrollton Police Department, 142 by other police agencies, and 11 by individuals. There was one (1) jury trial held in 2016.

Receipts in the Carroll County Court during 2016 total \$707,621.43 – 710,046.64 was paid to the following agencies: \$325,377.83 to the County for fines, \$13,674.90 to the State for fines, \$11,723.50 to the Sheriff's Department for sheriff fees and drug fines, \$6,208.50 to the Ohio Department of Natural Resources for Game Warden and Division of Forestry fines, \$630.00 to the State of Ohio for expungement of files, \$5,867.00 to the State of Ohio for seatbelts, \$125.00 to the State for liquor fines, \$65,115.20 to the State for Rotary fees, \$9,399.00 to the State for Legal Aid Societies Fund, \$7,362.48 for Trusteeship creditors & Rent Escrow Accounts, \$1,939.25 to the State Board of Pharmacy for drug fines, and \$262,623.98 was paid out for garnishment payments, various villages for ordinance fines, and deposit refunds. The Court has received \$117,625.32 through our website payments and Capital Recovery Systems has collected \$58,772.53 on delinquent monies due the court.

A total of 278 new individuals were placed on probation in 2016. A total of 5387.5 hours of community service were performed. A total of \$60,488.50 was collected as a contribution in lieu of community service pursuant to O.R.C. 2929.27. A total of \$40,584.07 was collected in probation fees, and \$12,303.59 in restitution was collected and paid directly to victims through the probation department.

The Court's balance on hand as of December 31, 2016, is \$73,568.45
